and risk assessment. She also serves as an expert in negligent or inadequate security litigation.

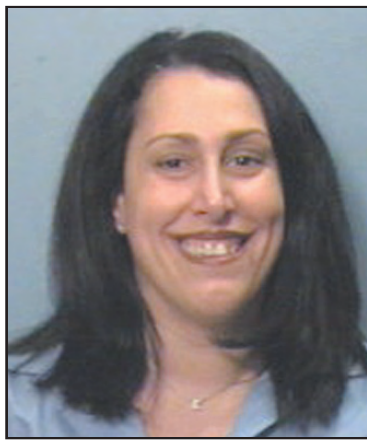
Marty Patnaude, CPP, American Alarm & Communications, Inc.

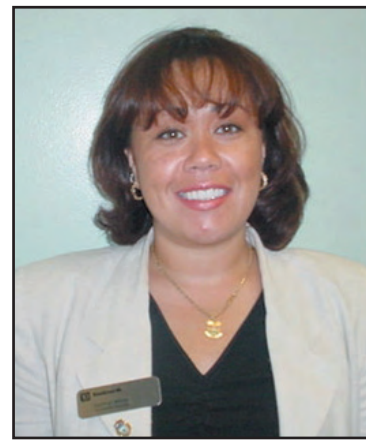
company with the Boston & Cambridge Police.
